HISTORY -

Learning Objectives:

To study over time how several aspects of national history are reflected in the locality .

- To study the impact of the Roman invasion on York and other areas.

To study the Roman Empire and its impact on Britain

- Julius Caesar's attempted invasion in 55-54 BC
- The Roman Empire by AD 42 and the power of its army
- Successful invasion by Claudius and conquest, including Hadrian's Wall
- British resistance, for example, Boudicca

ART

Learning Objectives:

- To create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.
- To learn about great artists, architects and designers in history. And understand cultural and historical development of their art.

MUSIC—pentatonic scales

Learning Objectives:

- play and perform in solo and ensemble contexts, using their voices and playing musical instruments with increasing accuracy, fluency, control and expression
- improvise and compose music for a range of purposes using the inter-related dimensions of music

GEOGRAPHY

- use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.
- use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and key (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge.
